A Devotional from the Editor

Singing to God is one of my favorite ways to worship. Not that I am a good singer, I stink, but, when I forget my worries and offer up simple songs of heartfelt praise to God, a connection is made with my Father on a deep level. For many years, I thought the connection I had with God through song was a one way street. I thought I was the one who did all the singing. I was wrong. In Zephaniah 3:17 it says; **“The LORD your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with singing”.**

Did you know that God, the Almighty maker of thunder, who can destroy and create with a single breath, sings over YOU? God, the perfect Father, sings over his child to quiet His precious one. The Cuban people can find refuge in the midst of chaos knowing God is singing an anthem of peace to their hearts. When the tears won't stop coming and the pain won't stop throbbing, He is there. The Lord's arms are big enough to cradle all of Cuba, and sing a sweet lullaby to mend the broken hearts of His people. If you have never let God hold you in his arms, I encourage you to do so, and be free in His embrace.

The verse also says that God “will exult” over you. The word “exult” has two meanings in Hebrew; 1) To rejoice greatly;

be jubilant or triumphant, and 2) To leap upward, especially for joy. Imagine the perfect God not only nestling you like a newborn in his arms, but leaping and dancing in utter joy over His creation! What a God we serve! This could be why Paul wrote in Philippians 4:4 **“Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!”** Consider how much God loves you, he sings over you when you need healing, and leaps for joy out of His love for you. At ECHO-Cuba, we pray that your heart is filled with the joy of the Lord.

We are excited to begin a new column in our newsletter that features different travelers and their experiences on the mission field in Cuba.



Kelly traveled to Cuba in early May with another classmate. She was kind enough to answer a few questions about her trip (the names of our Cuban representatives have been changed):

ECHO: What exactly could you do in a closed country like Cuba?

KELLY: We walked all over Havana, from memorials, to the giant cemetery, to plazas, and churches. Maria made dinner for us, took us for ice cream and to an old fort to watch the cannons. They also took us out one night to go dancing. Her and a friend also took us around to 8 of the sick elderly they work with. This was the best part of the whole trip. They were living in deep poverty, had no one to take care of them, and were sick for various reasons like a liver problem, or throat cancer.

Experiencing that was by far the most memorable thing of the

ECHO: What memories will you carry with you for the rest of your life?

KELLY: Seeing poverty so clearly. In the streets yes, there’s poverty, but it was not until we visited the elderly in their one room homes with no light that it really hit me hard.

ECHO: How has this trip grown you as a person?

KELLY: It has further pushed my life in a direction to make this world a better place. By-standing will get one nowhere and since being in Cuba I have been very motivated to be active all around my community. Before Cuba I was very active in politics, organizing events, etc. But I would get discouraged at the pace of how long it takes to motivate *other* people. Everything I learned about the Cuban revolution while being there just makes me want to put forth all my efforts and never give up. Now whether that is on a localized level or a global one, one will just have to wait and see.

ECHO in the Island

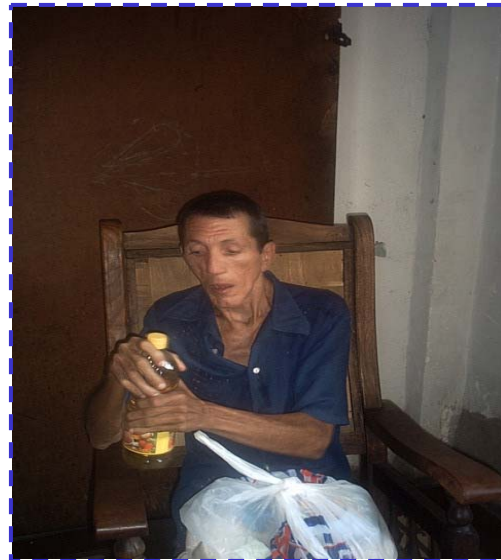
Echo Cuba works closely with churches in Cuba and directs diverse humanitarian projects throughout the provinces of Cuba. For those who have not been introduced to the ministries ECHO-Cuba sustains, more information can be found in our website listed on the bottom of the page. Lately communicating with the people in Cuba has been a problem. The Cuban people have very restricted access to internet connection and email accounts. Some of them have emails but only after a long difficult process that does not give them the security of safe communication. Others have clandestine email accounts which cost approximately sixty dollars a month. The situation gets more difficult as the days go by and I'm asking you dear reader, please pray for our situation as email communication is a main source of Echo's transactions with Cuba. **We cannot help them, if we cannot communicate with them.** We received a report informing us of the progress of the ministry in the eastern part of Cuba. ECHO-Cuba's entire heart is in helping those who cannot help themselves. We hope these testimonies that follow affect your life today as it has ours; and that you may become part of this spiritual as well as physical revolution in Cuba.
