

OUR HISTORY...



EchoCuba was founded in 1994 by a group of North American Evangelicals who felt a great calling to advocate for faith and freedoms in Cuba and help support the emerging independent Cuban Christian Church. Responding to the needs amongst the churches, EchoCuba began administering humanitarian assistance programs to churches, located primarily in Eastern Cuba.

Funded by the generosity of private donors, EchoCuba began distributing much needed vitamins and medical supplies to the communities serviced by the evolving network of independent Protestant churches. Through continued private donations, EchoCuba a was able to provide funding and support to these emerging ministries and churches, assisting them in building their congregations and implementing sustainability programs within their communities. EchoCuba also supported educational programs that bolstered the professionalization of their clergy.

Currently, EchoCuba works with over 600 organized faith-based groups, made up mostly of Protestant and Roman Catholic churches, which are independent of the government-controlled Council of Churches, and have extended our reach to over 4,000 religious locations throughout the island. Within our network of churches, we help provide social services to handicapped children and adults, and care for the elderly. We assist in the development of entrepreneurs, encourage free market principles, and educate the churches and its congregation on savings and tithing.

EchoCuba also provides tools to help train existing and future clergy. Over the last several years, EchoCuba a has built and stocked more than 400 "mini-libraries" in churches throughout the country.

EchoCuba is making a significant impact on the growth and health of the Evangelical Church in Cuba by facilitating leadership and theological training and through the provision of technological resources.




ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

the venue of business ownership; our projects combine business principles with a


